33 History: This building is historically known as Capt. Frank W. Hall's office (c1881) and the Housley's Shoe Shop (c1930s). It was originally unpainted and was built by Capt. Hall as a personal office. It was the first location of the original Bank of Dahlonga (in 1913 there was a bank robbery) and then Mr. Housely's Shoe Shop during the depression. Alec Housely was fundamental in the development of the chicken industry which has become a significant factor of the local economy. He raised chickens in the back of the building and incubated chicks in tin boxes in the show store.

According to an interview written by Valentine Dobbs, Fry's granddaughter, William Fry came to Dahlenega from South Dakota in 1890 by the Crown Mountain Mine Company to be superintendent of the mine in Dahlenega. The mine company gave Fry the 1 acre property for a homesite. In 1890, Fry brought an electrician

from Atlanta to wire his home for electricity. According to Mrs. Price Bowen (1976 historical survey), the house at one time, was design so that the 1 floor was divided by partitions with the capability to make one large room for home church fellowships. Traveling preachers would stay in the upstairs bedrooms.
